EOPS

EOPS is a California State funded program established to recruit, enroll, and retain students. EOPS is designed to assist students who are identified as economically and educationally disadvantaged. Eligible students are provided with a wide range of support services to enable them to succeed at Grossmont College.

Financial Aid

Financial Aid exists to help students who might otherwise be unable to complete their education because of financial problems.

Students may apply for financial aid in the form of grants, scholarships, loans, and work.

DSPS

DSP&S strives to support Grossmont College in the inclusion of students with disabilities as independent, responsible, and productive members of the community.

Various services and programs are available to assist students while they attend classes.

CalWORKS

The goal of CalWORKS is to help parents on welfare improve the quality of their lives through education, and meet their personal goals for family economic self-sufficiency.

Veterans Affairs

Grossmont College is an approved institution for the training of veterans under United States and California statuses. The Veterans Office on campus will provide information regarding service-connected benefit programs, e.g., Veterans Dependents-War Orphans and Widows, Disabled Veterans and G.I. Benefits.

This office is designed to serve the needs of veterans who qualify for education benefits. The student will receive assistance in filing for benefits, updating information on various forms, and in corresponding with the Veterans Administration.
