5 Languages to Communicate Love

"To love is nothing. To be loved is something, but to love and be loved is everything." -T. Tolis. Have you ever wondered if there is a language that you can speak to transmit love? Gary Chapman, who is a relationship counselor and the author of The Five Love Languages, explained that after many years of counseling, he realized that there are five main languages to communicate love. They are: Words of affirmation, Quality time, Receiving Gifts, Act of Service and Physical touch. Words of affirmation are words to give compliments and encouragement to our loved ones, while Quality time is sharing time and doing activities with those whom we care about the most. Receiving gifts is to make or buy something for the other person to show that you have thought of them. Furthermore, Acts of service is the action that you help out in every type of situation, for example, housework or special projects. Finally, Physical touch is a physical contact with your loved one, such as holding hands, kissing, hugging or sexual intercourse. Sometimes we may speak a language believing that we are communicating love, but the other person may not understand our language; as a result, he or she might not feel loved by us. Understanding what love language you and your loved ones speak is really important to receive and transmit love in a way that makes us feel really loved. Furthermore, we are able to improve our connections with our loved ones, and be happier. The three most important love languages in my life are: Quality time, Word of affirmation and Acts of service. Realizing what love language my loved ones and I speak made me improve my relations with them.

My primary love language is Quality time. Nothing is more important for me than sharing time with my loved ones. According to Gary Chapman, the main point of quality time is to give our full attention to the other person by doing something together and increasing the concept of "togetherness." Besides, it does not really matter what you are

doing, or where you are going, the real purpose of this love language is to be together. Also, conversing is really important for those like me that consider quality time their primary love language. It is very important for us to have daily conversations in which we can share our emotions and the events of the day, and we desire our loved one to pay full attention to listen to us. We want our loved ones to share their feelings and emotions as well to be more emotionally close. This sharing of feelings is very important to fill our love tank and feel loved. One of the moments when I feel most loved is when someone I care gives me their full attention by listening to me, for I feel like I am important to them. Gary Chapman explains that to give compliments and encouraging words is really important for people whose primary love language is words of affirmation. We cannot say sweet words in a sarcastic way, for the person who we are talking with will interpret our words based on how the tone of

our voice sounds. The main point of this love language is to feel valued and appreciated from the people we care about the most. Regarding children, we all know that children crave our full attention in every way. However, after reading this book, I realized what love language my 5-year-old brother craves the most. For example, every time my family and I have to go somewhere and dress nice, he comes to my mom and me and starts to give us many compliments that how nice and beautiful we look just to show himself and receive compliments as well. It is obvious that he craves compliments, and it is like Gary Chapman said, "Your method of expressing love may be an indication that that would also make you feel loved" (139). That is definitely my brother's case. He loves when someone compliments him and makes him feel special. Also, whenever I told him "Wow Joshua, you look amazing with that suit. You are going to be the nice boy of the evening I love you" he would reply "thank you" with a blushing face and a satisfied look that showed me that he got what he wanted. In the end, it is really easy for me to give him compliments and sweet words because with his sweetness it would be impossible for me not to say anything. For this reason, he certainly knows that I love him, and also I do not have to put so much effort to show him that.

Gary Chapman claims that washing dishes, cleaning up, cooking, doing laundry, and helping your loved one with a project are all acts of service. "What can I do to help you?" is one of the most important questions that a person in the "Acts of Service" category wants to hear. As a matter of fact, you can make these people feel loved by helping and doing favors for them. Knowing that my father's primary love language is "Acts of Service" makes it easy for me to understand how to express love to him. Now I do remember and understand all his requests in the past when he asked me to help him to cook or to iron his shirts. I finally realized why he was so sad and criticized every time I denied to help him. "People tend to criticize most loudly in the area where they themselves have the deepest emotional need" (107). My father and I are really similar. His primary love language is my second important one, but we used to fight all the time. Why is that? For the simple reason that we could not meet each other's needs. I always feel love from him because he always cooked for me, and worked hard to provide the food. On the other hand, he did not always felt loved by me even though I was washing dishes, doing laundry and sweeping the floor. All those things were fine, but they were not what he craved the most from me. They were all "Act of service" actions, but like the example in the book, my father and I were speaking different dialects too, which means that I was not doing what he wanted the most. Film Analysis

In this essay, I will analyze the in-class film Enough Said with critical observing eves, the interactions interpersonal between the characters and their communication styles. Also I will analyze some of interactions with significant others, relating with the book Interplay, using chapters 9, 10, 11 and 12.

"Sometimes the basis of

this attraction comes from learning about ways we are similar, either

in experiences or attitudes." (Chapter 9, page 276) Albert invited Evan for dinner and since it was their first time going out it is pretty normal to ask questions, but as it goes and they see their similarity, they attract each other more. The questions started as "What do you do?" and the questions/answers that connected them with similarities as they are both divorced and have kids, who are going to college out of town.

"Some conflict approaches are so destructive that they are almost guaranteed to wreak havoc on relationships." (Chapter 12, page 383) Eva agrees with her best friend Sarah to invite Albert for a dinner in Sarah's house. During the dinner, Eva starts to criticize Albert for everything and be unpolitic, constraining him in front of Eva's friends. Criticism is considered one of four toxic forms of communication, and in the movie we can notice that Albert got really upset with Evan. After the dinner he drove her directly to her house, affirming that he was offended. Albert even says: "I feel that I spent the afternoon with my ex-wife."

"The terms dishonesty and manipulation reflect the nature of strategy." (Chapter 11, page 353) What happens is that at the same party that was presented to Albert, Eva gets one more customer for their massage, Marianne. The complicated thing is that Albert is Marianne's ex-husband, and Eva discovers gradually because of the constant complaints that Marianne tells her about her ex. She says horrors about a man who she was married to a while ago. However, she did not know what to do and then kept going out with him and seeing all the bad things in him as his ex-wife described, even that she would probably not care about. At the end, she was at Marianne's house and Albert gets there, and the situation lead us to understand that Eva was playing strategy with both of them, even when it was not her intention.

"...we are uncomfortable around those who are too competent—perhaps because we look bad by comparison." (Chapter 9, page 275) When my communication professor announced that the class required two presentations I got really nervous. First, I thought that it would be almost impossible, then that it would be okay; then, after the first day of presentations, I got really scared. I have a reason to feel uncomfortable: the first group of people presented really well so that I was impressed. I do not have a lot of experience with speeches, at least not in English; also, I feel that I am the only international student in the class, which makes me feel even more nervous. I am confident that everything will be okay and I will survive, but I have to confess that after watching my classmate's speech I got more nervous.

"Cross-sex friendships—at least for heterosexuals—present some challenges that don't exist among all-male or all-female companionship." (Chapter 10, page 310) As a girl that grew up surrounded by male friends until 14 years old, I have believed and tried many times to have cross-sex friendships. Until I was 12 years old, boys would just provoke me and I would run after them, and then we would all laugh about it. However, when I turned 14 years old I started having problems with my friends that were boys, because they started showing attraction and second intentions besides our friendship. With time I learned to hardly trust any man

that said he just wanted to be my friend. Recently, I passed through an interesting situation. When I was 13 years old, I used to play tennis with Giovanni, who is 2 years older than me. I was "in love" and he would not be interested on me at all (especially at my age) and curiously we turned out to be "best friends" 2 years later. We would talk every week, and when I was in Brazil, we would go out together for years and he never showed any different interest on me for those 5 years of intimacy. However, when we started talking again, I was 15 years old and I was in the beginning of my first relationship and got on my second relationship pretty soon. Almost 4 months ago, when I broke up, he came to talk to me and he declared that he had been in love for 2 years and he was waiting for this opportunity. However, I noticed many flaws in my way to communicate and solve problems using this technique. being tired of unsolved problems and many unnecessary fights, I started to use more complex phrases, and use the word "I" in a way to not put pressure on the other. Last week I argued with my ex-boyfriend and noticed that he used many insults disguised in statements using "you."

Analyzing my past relationship, I could see that we passed through all the styles of handling a conflict. I have noticed that at the beginning we would deal by accommodation: "...when we allow others to have their own way rather than asserting our own point of view." (Chapter 12, page 373) When it was the beginning, I believe we would do that to other to please each other, as a sign of love. Then, after one year, we turned to competition. It is a win-lose situation, when both want to be right. One of my passions is law, so imagine someone that likes to argue until something is solved, and there is one right and one wrong! Furthermore, in our last stage of the

relationship, we were using avoidance: "Avoidance occurs when people ignore or stay away from conflict." (Chapter 12, page 372) We would have a problem, start to argue and then just let it go. I used to say: "You have your opinion, I have mine. It seems that nothing will change and no one will surrender, so let's move on." I do not think it is the best way to deal with problems, especially because after practicing avoidance for 6 months, we broke up. When we discuss what we did wrong in our relationship, this is one of the reasons we point to.

Throughout the movie, I could see again how communication is important. I could see the Eva was being affected by everything Marianne said about Albert, and the miscommunication, because she realized that they were married, but she did not know what to do or say about it. It includes when they discover that she knew all along and she did not know how to communicate to fix it and explain her side.
