Lived Experiences of Iraqi Refugee Students in Community College

Presenter: Gopa Patnaik This is my dissertation topic that researched the lived experiences of Iraqi refugee students at Community Colleges. Using a phenomenological approach this study seeks to illuminate and understand the essence of meanings that Iraqi refugee students attach to their community college experiences in a new country and make sense of these experiences. Their academic challenges are vastly different from students that come from non refugee backgrounds. Although there is some existing literature on refugee and immigrant students' experiences in community elementary and secondary education, there is a paucity of research on the specific experiences of Iraqi refugees as they transition into a community college in their new homeland. Data were collected by interviewing Iraqi refugee students who were recruited from the Educational Opportunity Programs and Services Department (EOPS). Purposive sampling was utilized and data were transcribed and analyzed by a statistical software called Saturate. The three themes that emerged from their transition process were (a) Navigating the System; (b) Academic Barriers; (c) Sense of Belonging. Bourdieu's notion of habitus and forms of capital served as the theoretical framework for this research. **Eligible for 1 hour flex credit**
