### CSU REQUIREMENT ONLY: CSU GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

U.S. HISTORY, CONSTITUTION AND AMERICAN IDEALS: 6 units (may be completed prior to transfer). Select either Track 1, 2 or 3. Complete 2 courses, 1 course from Part A and 1 course from Part B.

It is recommended that students complete both courses at Grossmont College in order to guarantee the CSU AI requirement is met.

**Track 1:** One course from A and one from B

A: HIST 108, HIST/CCS 118, HIST 122, HIST/CCS 130, HIST/CCS 180

B: HIST 109, HIST/CCS 119, HIST 123, HIST/CCS 131, HIST/CCS 181, POSC 140

**Track 2:** One course from A and one from B

**Track 3:** One course from A and one from B

**Additional Option:** AP US History (Score of 3 or higher) + HIST 123 or 124 or POSC 121 or 140.

\*Out-of-State courses used to satisfy American Institution requirement will be determined by the CSU campus to which you transfer.

**6A: LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH (UC Requirement Only) - All must be verified by official records either on high school transcripts or by exam scores sent to Grossmont College Admissions and Records Office. Because the UC System does not count "minus" or "plus" grades from high school, for 6A, only, a high school C- grade is acceptable to clear LOTE. See a Counselor for additional information.**

College Course(s) that meet the proficiency level—American Sign Language 120, Arabic 120, Chinese 120, French 120, German 120, Italian 120, Japanese 120, Russian 120, Spanish 120 or higher level.

2 years of high school coursework in the same foreign language with a grade of "C-" or higher.

Achieve a score of 3 or higher on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination in a language other than English.

Achieve a score of 500-540 (depending on language – verify with a Counselor) on The SAT II: Subject Test in Languages other than English.

Achieve a score of 5 or higher on the (IB) International Baccalaureate Higher Level Examinations in language other than English. English "O" level exams (score of "A", "B" or "C") and English International "A" exams (score of 5, 6, or 7) are also accepted.

Documented satisfactory completion of 2 or more years of formal schooling at the 6<sup>th</sup> grade or higher in an institution where the language of instruction is not English.

Statement from a foreign language instructor (must be an original copy on official college/university letterhead) documenting proficiency.

\*\*The IGETC **may not** clear all general education requirements for students planning to pursue the following majors/colleges at the universities listed below:

**Students must request Official certification by the Grossmont College Admissions- Evaluations Office. For additional information and clarification, review the IGETC Q & A which is available in the Counseling Center.**

1. Obtain a new IGETC list each year as there may be additions or deletions. The course must be on the list at the time you take the course.
2. All courses must be completed with grades of "C" or better. "D or C- "grades are not acceptable for IGETC.
3. Courses can be certified in only 1 area.
4. IGETC does not guarantee admission.
5. Courses may be taken for a "P (Pass)" grade, but the CSU/UC systems have a limit on the number of units. Check the transfer institution catalog.
6. Foreign language is required for the UC system. See 6A. Students must request official college transcripts from other colleges or high school and/or examination center if the foreign language needs to be verified. Request that they be sent to the Grossmont College Admissions and Records Office as soon as possible.
7. There are limitations at UC's—high unit majors, professional schools, etc., that may restrict the use of IGETC. See list of UC limitations in the Counseling Office.
8. Summer school is part of the prior year. The UC system strongly recommends completion of IGETC certification by spring semester if transferring for a fall semester/quarter.
9. Make an appointment with a Counselor to discuss the IGETC pattern or visit the Grossmont College Transfer Center.

\*Indicates that transfer credit may be limited by either UC or CSU or both. Please consult with counselor for additional information or check the current catalog.
