SDSU accepts AA-T degrees in Political Science. This major includes a 3rd semester language competency requirement to graduate from SDSU. Check with a Counselor for applicability to other CSU's. The Political Science AA-T requires a minimum 2.4 Cumulative G.P.A.

Students applying with the AA-T in Political Science will receive priority in the admissions process but are not guaranteed admittance into the CSU of their choice.

Admission is highly competitive for most CSU's. Students are strongly advised to go above and beyond minimum G.P.A requirements and apply for admission at multiple campuses.
