Completion of the full CSU or UC IGETC certification (CA), Washington and Oregon state-approved Direct Transfer degrees or other state's equivalent transfer certification prior to the student being admitted, enrolled and attending his/her first session in a bachelor degree program at Brandman satisfies all Brandman University GE requirements except LBSU 302 & 304. Students who matriculate to Brandman with partial GE certifications will have their coursework evaluated on a course by course basis to determine appropriate applicability to each general education category.

**This list includes only the requirements that are commonly seen in transfer, and is not a comprehensive list of all the course requirements within the BA Early Childhood Education program. All courses must be passed with a grade equivalent of "C" or higher. Courses may be used to fulfill both major and general education requirements.

The Curriculum Alignment Eight (CAP 8) may be transferred in from a community college. A request to transfer coursework CAP 8 approved courses must have been taken after the date the institution was aligned through the Child Development Training Consortium. An Associate's degree in Child Development or Early Childhood Education earned at a regionally accredited institution may be used to fulfill the CAP 8 requirement.
