

Grossmont College Articulation Agreement 2013-2014

The following courses taken at Grossmont College will transfer to the University of Redlands School of Business in fulfillment of the requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Business and Bachelor of Arts in Management Degrees.

Students must complete 120 credits of semester academic credit with a minimum 2.0 GPA to earn their degree. Only grades of 2.0 (C) or higher will transfer. These must include 42 semester credits of General Education. A minimum of 9 of these credits must be earned at the upper-division level (see your School of Business Student Services Manager for upper-division courses).

Completion of Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) and/or California State University (CSU) General Education patterns will not automatically fulfill UOR's lower division general education requirements. Courses taken at participating colleges through Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) will transfer to the University of Redlands as follows:
