Competency in reading, writing, and expression is shown by achieving a "C" grade or higher or "Pass" in courses listed under *Area A, Section 1- Written Communication*.

Competency in Mathematics is shown by either earning a grade of "C" or better or "Pass" in Math 103 or a higher numbered Mathematics course **OR** assessing into Math 120 or higher through the mathematics placement process. (Students meeting competency through assessment must still take an Area A3 course). See page 31 of the catalog for additional information on competency requirements.

ASSOCIATES DEGREE GRADUATION CHECK LIST:

- ___ 1. Have a GPA of 2.0 ("C" average or better overall).
- ___ 2. Declare a major, whether it be a general studies or a specific major (i.e., Child Development, Nursing, Administration of Justice, etc.).
- ___ 3. Complete at least 60 degree applicable college units.*
- ___ 4. Complete general educational requirements.
- ___ 5. Complete major coursework.
- ___ 6. Meet Math and English competency requirements.
- ___ 7. Send all official transcripts from other colleges to Admissions and Records the semester before you apply for graduation.
- ___ 8. It is recommended that you apply for graduation as soon as you have registered for your final courses needed to meet degree requirements. Check graduation application deadline date in college catalog or semester class schedule.
