	<p><b>1) Submit Grossmont College Application</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Visit <a href="http://Grossmont.edu">Grossmont.edu</a> and click “Apply/Find Classes”</li> </ul>
	<p><b>2) Grossmont – Cuyamaca Promise</b></p> <p>Grossmont- Cuyamaca Promise provides two-years of free tuition to first-time college students who meet the requirements. To learn more and to sign the promise pledge go to <a href="http://MyCollegePromise.net">MyCollegePromise.net</a>.</p>
	<p><b>3) Complete Online Orientation</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Log into WebAdvisor</li> <li>Click on “Students”</li> <li>Under Orientation/Assess/Advising, <b>Click Step 1- Online Orientation</b></li> </ul>
	<p><b>4) Receive Placement/Assessment</b></p> <p>Determine your placement level in Math and English, or ESL Use the online guided self-placement questionnaire:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Log into WebAdvisor</li> <li>Click on “Students”</li> <li>Under Orientation/Assess/Advising, <b>Click Step 2- Assessment/Placement Questionnaire</b></li> </ul> <p>The questionnaire will determine if English language learners will need to take the ESL assessment.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If the ESL Assessment is needed, register for one of our scheduled ESL assessment sessions through WebAdvisor or call the Assessment center at (619) 644-7200</li> </ul>
	<p><b>5) Apply for Financial Aid or California DREAM Act</b></p> <p>We offer a full array of financial aid programs- grants, scholarships to full-time and part-time students.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA): <a href="http://studentaid.ed.gov">studentaid.ed.gov</a></li> <li>California Dream Act Application is for undocumented students: <a href="http://dream.csac.ca.gov">dream.csac.ca.gov</a></li> </ul>
	<p><b>6) Create an Abbreviated Education Plan</b></p> <p>This is a one semester plan with recommended courses to take based on student’s educational goals. You have two options to complete this step:</p> <p>Option 1 (Online)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Log into WebAdvisor</li> <li>Click on “Students”</li> <li>Under Orientation/Assess/Advising, <b>Click Step 3- Online Advising</b></li> </ul> <p>Option 2 (In person)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Attend a MINI session at the counseling center located in building 10</li> </ul> <p><i>Note: In order to complete this step, you must have completed the online Assessment/Placement Questionnaire.</i></p>
	<p><b>7) Register and Pay for Classes</b></p> <p>You will be able to view your registration date/time and register for classes through WebAdvisor under the “Registration” menu. You can pay on WebAdvisor or Cashier’s office located in building 10.</p>

**Request College Transcripts/Advanced Placement (AP) Test scores**

Official AP test scores and college transcripts from all colleges and universities previously attended must be requested and submitted to the Admissions and Records office.
