ELIGIBILITY FOR TRANSFER TO CSU

If not qualified for admission from high school, you must complete at least 60 transferable units , to include the following:

At least 30 units of general education courses from this list are required. A1 (Oral Communication), A2 (Written Communication), A3 (Critical Thinking) and B4 (Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning) must be completed prior to admission. All 30 units of general education courses must be completed with a "C" or better grade in each course.

NOTE: Certification is not automatic. Students must request certification from the Grossmont College Admissions Office after acceptance to a university.
