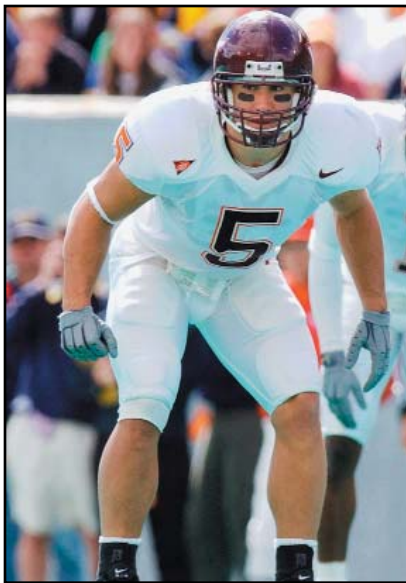


Grossmont College Defensive Backs An Amazing History

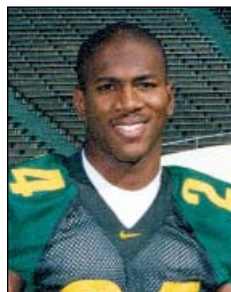

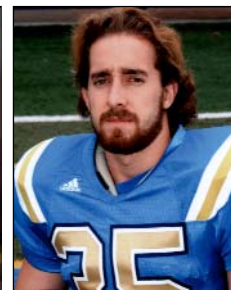

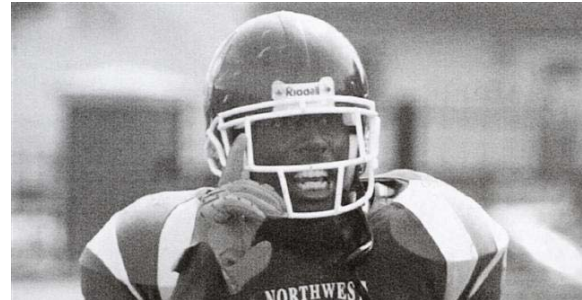

Quinten Womack - Northwest (MO) '05

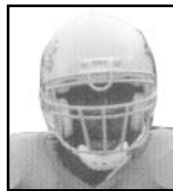

Jay Taylor - out of St. Augustine HS - became an All-Conference corner for the Griffs. He started for San Jose State, then stayed with the Arizona Cardinals for four years.

Ron O'Bard attended Monte Vista HS, then played for BYU, and then had a 2-year stay with the San Diego Chargers.

Gary Wehlege - a graduate of Santana HS - played for the Griffs two years. He earned a scholarship to Colorado State where he became an "All-WAC" corner.

You might find a larger school with a big stadium (with few spectators), but you'll never find one that compares with the great tradition of "moving our players on up."
