# To Out-of-State - Out-of-Area



The first year will be especially tough and unfortunately, because of California laws and time restraints on an already over-worked staff, we are not able to give you a lot of help. However, we will do all we can, legally, in helping you with living arrangements. Others will help also. The EOPS, Financial Aid, and Administration offices are very supportive. California community colleges DO NOT HAVE ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIPS. Any help you get must come only from Financial Aid packages, parents, friends, etc. You cannot make it on financial aid alone.

When all is said and done, the **responsibility** is **yours**. We do not want anyone to come here unless 100% financially capable of making it. We have had to send young men home because they were ill-prepared financially.

#### **IMPORTANT**

There are **NO** guarantees here. You will be competing for a position against many who are headed for DI or DIAA universities after their stay here. However, if you, your high school coach, parents, and college recruiters feel you are in that category, the rewards of being a Grossmont College football player can be great and your future could be a bright one.

## **Registration Fees**

Enrollment Fee (California residents) \$20.00 per unit

Health Fee (Mandatory – includes Accident Insurance) \$13.00 Student Benefit Card (Grossmont College) \$12.00

Student Center Construction Fee (Mandatory) \$1.00 per unit to a maximum of \$5.00

Student Representation Fee \$1.00 Parking Fee: Auto Parking Permit \$40.00

Out-of-State Students – above fees *plus*.....\$156.00 a unit (you become a resident after one year)

You become a California resident **one year** after you rent an apartment and get a California driver's license or register to vote.

### **Jobs**

Most jobs are found by word of mouth and help of teammates. The college job placement or EOPS can give limited help, and if you're on financial aid and get in early, you are eligible for an on-campus job – mainly teacher aids, cafeteria work, or maintenance jobs. Football does not have job placement. The college has a limited job placement service.

#### Food

There are about 20 markets and 20 restaurants within a 7 mile radius of Grossmont College and a typical cafeteria right on campus.

# **Living Arrangements**

Housing costs vary considerably. In general, apartments closest to campus are most expensive. Those close to San Diego State (7 miles) are reasonable. Those in the main part of El Cajon, La Mesa, or Santee are least expensive (2-10 miles away). San Diego State University is 5 minutes from Grossmont. 
