PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETE RECRUITING CHECKLIST

We are looking forward to welcoming you to the Grossmont College Football program. We want the process of making you a part of our football program as quick and as easy as possible. To do that, you need to complete the following steps.

Grossmont College football has a long tradition of success and has been a power in the state and in the nation for the past 15 years. The Griffins have not had a losing season in a decade. Since the new playoff system was installed in 2003, Grossmont has won two Southern California championships, as well as a state and national title. They also have played in and won more playoff games than any other community college in the state. In 2009, Grossmont won its 5th straight bowl game beating perennial powerhouse El Camino College 27-22 in the US Bank Beach Bowl.

COA Bylaw 2.2.4 Only an out-of-recruiting area student athlete can make first person-to-person contact with a community college. This must be documented at the time of first contact by the community college staff member contacted.

Student athlete must fill out Prospect Information Form provided by the institution.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Before the recruiting process can begin for out of state or and out of area student-athletes you must fill out a Prospect Information Form:

- 1. FINANCIAL AID APPLICATION:** We encourage all of our prospective student-athletes to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) before attending Grossmont College. Prospective student-athletes should be prepared to cover their expenses with personal funds should they fail to complete the process in a timely manner or not qualify for financial aid.

STOP – if you have already completed an online 2010-2011 FASFA application. You will need to [CLICK THE LINK](#) to add Grossmont College School Code (001208).

- a. **STEP 1** – Prospects [CLICK THE LINK](#) to get your **PIN NUMBER**. This number is **NEEDED** prior to filling out the FAFSA online.
- b. **STEP 2** – Parents [CLICK THE LINK](#) to get their **PIN NUMBER**. This is needed to fill out your son’s FAFSA online and be able to submit.
- c. **STEP 3** – Gather this **REQUIRED** information to apply for the **FAFSA**:
 - Your Social Security number and your parents’ Social Security number(s), if you are under the age of 23 and not married.
 - Your driver’s license number if you have one.
 - Federal tax information or tax returns (1040) for your parents or the parent that claims you.
 - Records of untaxed income, such as social security benefits and veterans benefits.
 - Information on investments, business or farm assets.
 - Have your Grossmont College school number written down (001208). You will need this on your FAFSA application.
- d. **STEP 4** – With the above information and your **PIN NUMBER** and your parents **PIN NUMBER** begin the process of completing the FASFA: [CLICK THE LINK](#) make sure you write down or print your **confirmation number**.

3. GROSSMONT COLLEGE REGISTRATION FEES:

In-State Residents Fees

- Enrollment Fee (Mandatory)\$26 per unit
- Health Fee (Mandatory–includes Accident Insurance)\$14
- Student Benefit Card (Grossmont College)\$12
- Student Representation Fee*\$1

- 12 units x \$26 per unit = \$312.00 per semester in tuition fees not including: health, student benefit card, student representation fee, parking, and textbooks.
- Parking Fee:
Auto Parking Permit**\$40

Non-Resident Fees

- Non-resident Students — above fees plus.....\$190 per unit
- International Students — above fees plus.....\$190 per unit
- 12 units x \$190 per unit = \$2280.00 per semester in tuition fees not including: health, student benefit card, student representation fee, parking, and textbooks.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: All non-resident students can claim residences after their first year in the state and are subject to in-state residence fees.

4. HOUSING: Grossmont College does not provide housing. Housing costs vary considerably. In general, apartments closest to campus are most expensive. Those close to San Diego State (7miles) are reasonable. Those in the main part of El Cajon, La Mesa, or Santee are least expensive (2-10 miles away). San Diego State University is 5 minutes from Grossmont College. They do take Grossmont students in dormitories – expensive but includes meals and use of all facilities. [CLICK HERE](#)

IMPORTANT NOTICE: The student-athlete is responsible for all housing expenses and will not get any financial support for housing expenses from staff or employees of Grossmont College.

2 Bed/1 or 2 Baths: *(3/4 Persons)* \$270 to \$350 per month. **Keep the cost down by pairing up players with other student-athletes.** Most parents prefer to have their son’s room with other student-athletes because it cuts the cost down. Most athletes will share a two bedroom apartment with two players per room.

5. PLACEMENT TEST: All Freshmen must take an assessment test in Math, English, before they call enroll. You will need to come to Grossmont College to take the placement test. - 7. TRANSFERING FROM A 2 OR 4 YEAR INSTITUTION:** For those who are transferring from a two year institution or a four year college/university will need to have their transcripts available.
