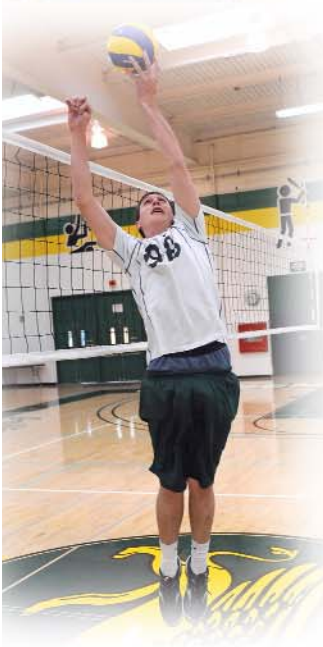

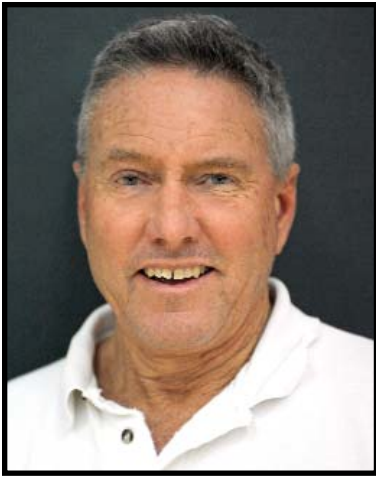

## HEAD COACH - FRED FEATHERSTONE

Coach Featherstone will be entering his twenty-first year as head coach of the Griffins men's program. In '07, the Griffs reached post-season playoff competition for the thirteenth time since 1990, Featherstone's first year. During Featherstone's tenure, Grossmont has secured three, third place finishes at the State Tournament since '90; one Orange Empire Conference Championship ('00); and he has been selected Coach of the Year four times ('94, '98, '00-men; '95-women). Adding to this impressive list of accomplishments, Coach Featherstone was rewarded for his coaching efforts in '07 by being named Pacific Coast Conference All Sports Coach of the Year after leading the Griffs, totaling 9 players by year's end, to a 13-5 record. In addition to coaching the Grossmont program since '90, Featherstone founded the Seaside Boys Junior Olympic Development Program in San Diego. Coach Featherstone's career record at Grossmont College stands at 183 wins and 166 losses.

Seaside has experienced unprecedented regional and national success under Featherstone's leadership. The club has medaled eight times in the open division of the United States Volleyball Association Junior Olympics including three ('92, '97, '06) National Championships at the 18 and under level. In '06, Seaside 18 Black, led by California and San Diego Athlete of the Year, Chase Budinger (La Costa Canyon High School), and All CIF, two-sport standout Garrett Muagututia (Francis Parker High School), Seaside won its third National Championship at the Junior Olympics in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Seaside has sent over 250 boys to college programs during the past twenty years with Featherstone directing the club. Coach Featherstone has had the privilege of coaching (5) former Seaside players who have been a part of the USA Men's National Team over the past ten years: Erik Sullivan (LCC), Scott Bunker (Orange Glen), Richard Lambourne (Serra), David Lee (Granite Hills) and Reid Priddy. From Grossmont College, Featherstone coached former Olympians James Hammerstrand and Ben Bodipo, and current Pro Beach (AVP) star Mat Olson. In addition, Grossmont has sent over 60 student-athletes on to four-year programs since 1990.

Coach Featherstone prepped at Mira Costa High School in Manhattan Beach, California. Fred began the school's first boy's volleyball program at the school in 1964. Since then, Micohi has produced more high school All Americans (both male and female), and won more state titles than any high school in the nation. In Featherstone's words, "Volleyball has been good fun both as a player and coach. I was raised four blocks away from the Manhattan Beach pier, the site of the famous Manhattan Beach Open, the 'Wimbledon' of beach volleyball, and was fortunate to be able to play in this tournament and many others over the years from age 16 on. Volleyball and surfing have been a major part of my lifestyle! I see the sport as the ultimate indoor team game and the beach game as the premier outdoor sport. Out West, this is the lifestyle and sport of choice for thousands of young males. Simply, this is what we do--ride waves and spike volleyballs. The sport belongs. It is my mission to help the process along as long as I'm physically and mentally able to do it."

Featherstone's other volleyball coaching stints include the USIU (United States International University) women's program from 1980-86, where he led the Division I program into national prominence in 1986; La Jolla High School boys ('73, '74); Southwestern College men ('76, '77) and girls and boys club with the San Diego Volleyball Club ('87-'89). In 1991, Fred coached the men's west team in the Summer Olympic Festival in Los Angeles. Fred is a certified USVBA Cap II program coach and his college career victory total stands at 301.

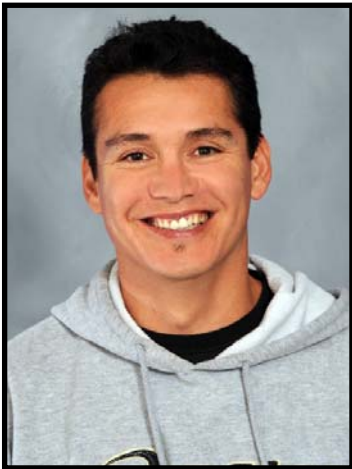
Featherstone was a three-sport athlete at San Diego State (football, track, volleyball) from '65-'70 and holds a master's degree in physical education from SDSU. At SDSU, Fred was an All American as a sprinter in '66 and '67 and played wide receiver and defensive back on the 1966 and '67 small college national championship football teams coached by Don Coryell. In volleyball, Featherstone has won numerous beach volleyball tournaments including two back-to-back Masters beach doubles championships ('99 and '00) at the 50-54 age level. Back in 1973 and 1974, Fred playing with his brother John, finished ninth in the Manhattan Beach Open.

Fred is married to wife Cheryl who has two children, Denny and Stacy. Fred's brother John is the Head Football Coach at El Camino College in Torrance, California. Fred and Cheryl like to spend time at the beach in San Diego and travel often through Baja California.



## **ASSISTANT COACH - TRAVIS LEE**

Grossmont welcomes Travis Lee back in 2010. Travis played for the Griffins in '06 and '07 and earned All Pacific Coast Conference honors as an outside hitter. Lee came to Grossmont College from Grossmont High School where he was All Grossmont League in 2005. In '07, Travis was selected Most Valuable Player for the Griffins. Since '06, Travis has been coaching for Seaside Volleyball Club, at the middle school and early high school levels. Coach Featherstone states, "Travis brings a lot of enthusiasm and passion to the gym every day. He is an outstanding player and is developing into one of the more respected young coaches in the county. In addition to working with our program, he is also assisting at Cathedral Catholic High School."



## **ASSISTANT COACH - JIMMY LOPEZ**

In '10, former Griffin setter Jimmy Lopez begins his third season as a Griffin assistant coach. Selected to the Orange Empire Conference First Team in '06, Jimmy backed that up in '07 with a First Team All Pacific Coast Conference spot.

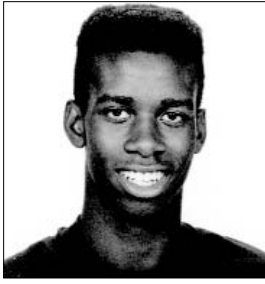
At 34 years of age, Jimmy brings a lot of adult maturity to the assistant's position. Aside from an illustrious playing career as an international setter, Jimmy has also coached at Sweetwater High School ('03), Coronado High School ('04), and Monte Vista High School ('05). Jimmy coached for Seaside VBC, as well, in '06, '07, and '08.

As a player in his native country, Mexico, Jimmy's teams--one a junior high school team--won two National Club Team Championships in Colima, Mexico in '93 and an Adult Open Championship in '01 in Sinaloa, Mexico. In addition, Jimmy has played extensively for the famous Mikaza and Ensenada Spikers International Club Teams and won the prestigious Estero Beach Doubles Tournament in '05.

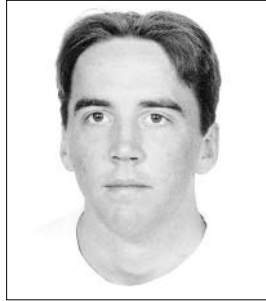
At Grossmont, Jimmy was chosen team MVP by his teammates in both '06 and '07. Prior to this he was a Pro Beach Mexico player in '03 and '04.

In Featherstone's words, "Jimmy brings years of on-court knowledge as a setter to the Grossmont program. Quite simply, he was the most experienced setter to ever play for me in 20 years of coaching. Jimmy has a great sense of humor and a real desire to further his coaching career. Small in stature, but big in heart and courage, I welcome him back to our program. ## **GRIFFIN MEN'S VOLLEYBALL 2010 SEASON OUTLOOK**

The Griffins in 2010 will be attempting to rebound from two consecutive sub-par seasons in '08 and '09. In spite of this reality, however, Grossmont finished at 5-1 versus San Diego County opponents in '09 and in fourth place in the tough Pacific Coast Conference.

What 2010 will bring, no one knows for sure, but Coach Featherstone likes what he sees from this year's crop of spikers. In Featherstone's words, "This team has solid setting with the return of all conference setter, Sezer Dundar. Next, Kyle McDonald (team MVP in '08) returns after concentrating hard on academics last year. This team will be small, but extremely quick. Tall is nice, but quickness and good ball control are better! This year's team will be young again (nine freshmen) but will be feisty and competitive against everyone they play. I like the team attitude, and unselfish play will carry a team a long way."

On the outside, the Griffs will be employing four newcomers and the competition for starting spots will be intense. Leading the way is Jose Mendoza who prepped in Tijuana, Mexico, and has played briefly with the Mexican National team and Club Baja in high school. Jose, at 5'10", is a complete player with a 40" vertical jump. Andrew Yamane, also 5'10", comes to Grossmont from San Gabriel (Village Christian H.S.) and claims to jump even higher! Andrew played for the San Gabriel VBC. A third, small, quick player, Dane Raleigh, also 5'10" (Hart H.S./Newhall) also has great hops, and, like the other two players, possesses great jumping ability as well. Featherstone states, "Quite honestly, I can't remember ever coaching three little guys that can play as well as these three. They're all fundamentally sound and fun to watch. They can hold their own against taller players." The fourth player at outside hitter, Ikaika Lewis, from Kalani High School in Hawaii, is 6'3" and 30 years old. In '97, Ike was an all Oahu interscholastic player. Both Yamane and Raleigh were all league in high school as well. Lewis is a waterman who has surfed 20' plus waves in Hawaii. He is a mature, unselfish team leader who will give the Griffs much needed depth on the outside.

At the middle blocking position, Grossmont will start the season with Aldo Loera, 6'2" (Mater DE, Catholic H.S.); and Jeff Zepp, 6'5" (West Ranch H.S./Stevenson, CA). In addition, Grossmont hopes to add Chris Reid, 6'8" (Serra H.S.) once the Griffs' basketball season ends. Loera, Zepp, and Reid can all play the opposite position, but, most likely, remain in the middle. Featherstone states, "As these players go, so goes the team. For us to be a playoff team, these three will have to step up, improve and be major factors. I'm confident they will. All four players were all league in high school and Loera, like Reid, also played basketball.

At opposite, McDonald returns after leading the Griffs in kills in '08. His maturity will help a great deal. Backing him up will be Isaiah Yandall (Norwalk H.S.). Isaiah was an all state defensive lineman in football at Trinity High School in Texas, before moving to California. At 6'5", 280 lbs., Isaiah is unquestionably the strongest player to ever play volleyball at Grossmont. "He can knock you silly if you catch one of his spikes in the head," states Coach Featherstone.

In the backcourt, Andre Fajardo will return as the starting libero. Much improved, Andre brings great all-around skills and vocal leadership as the team captain. The coaches are looking to him to have a great season. If needed, Fajardo can set, play middle, and play outside. Joining him in the back court will be newcomer Brent Borgese (Canyon H.S./Valencia). Brent was All League in high school and possesses outstanding passing and digging skills.

Rounding out the roster is one more setter, Cory Ferback. Ferback played down the road at Patrick Henry High School. Cory is a solid player with a great team attitude and will be called upon to spell Sezer Dundar and provide back-row depth at the "quarterback" spot.

In conclusion, Featherstone is pleased to have both Travis Lee and Jimmy Lopez back to assist him in 2010. They will help the Griffs gain an edge against the competition in 2010. The goal is the same: Be the top dog in San Diego and attempt to knock off one of the Orange County colleges to gain access to the State Tournament.

**Sezer Dundar - Freshman - Setter - 6'2"**

Returning all conference setter. Tallied 612 assists in '09 as a freshman. All high school conference player in 2002 and 2003 in his native country of Turkey. Experienced setter with great court awareness and the ability to set pin-to-pin with good location. Solid server and defensive player. Smart and deceptive. Heading to Missouri Valley College next year.

**Andre Fajardo - Freshman - Libero/Outside Hitter - 5'10"**

Returning starting libero for Griffs. Can play any position on floor including middle blocker. Led team in digs in '09. Solid passer, server, defender. All League in high school in '07 and '08. MVP of Mesa League in '07. Started in the secondary as a defensive back on the high school football team. Father Tony is the head boys coach at Otay Ranch. Hall of Fame Seaside VBC player. Counted on to play a major role this year for Griffs to make playoffs. Hopes to play at four-year level beginning next year.

**Kyle McDonald - Sophomore - Opposite/Outside Hitter - 6'3"**

Returns to Griffs after earning team MVP honors in '08. Lefty who can play left or right. Led team in kills in '08 with 151 and a percentage of .332. All Sierra Foothills League in high school. All league in water polo as well. Played basketball also. Played club ball with Norcal VBC. Versatile player with good all around skills. Loves to play. Good on beach and grass as well. One of team's most complete players. More mature in 2010 than he was in '08.

**Brent Borgese - Freshman - Libero - 6'0"**

Aggressive backcourt player from Canyon High School in Valencia. Played club ball with Synergy and Classic VBC. Played on Synergy Bronze medalist team in '07. All League in '08. With Fajardo, will get considerable playing time in the backcourt as passer/defender.

**Ikaika Lewis - Freshman - Outside Hitter - 6'3"**

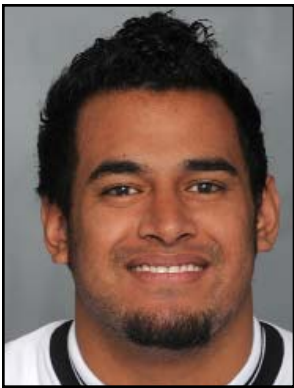
