On April 6, 2001, former Griffin volleyball player and team captain, Ryan Niles, (Grossmont High School, 1993), tragically passed away in an auto accident. Ryan starred for the Griffins in '94 and '95 helping to lead the team to a third place finish in the State Championships in '94.

After leaving Grossmont College, Ryan became a starter for the San Diego State Aztecs in the years 1996 and 1997.

He will be forever in our thoughts and prayers.



Head Coach - Fred Featherstone

Coach Featherstone will be entering his seventeenth year as head coach of the Griffins men's program. Last year the Griffs reached post-season playoff competition for the twelfth time since 1990, Featherstone's first year. During Featherstone's tenure, Grossmont has secured three, third place finishes at the State Tournament since '90; one Orange Empire Conference Championship ('00); and he has been selected Coach of the Year four times ('94, '98, '00-men; '95-women). Last year, the Griffins overcame an 0-5 start in conference play to rebound and win its final five matches and qualify for the So Cal Regional Playoffs.

In addition to coaching the Grossmont program since '90, Featherstone founded the Seaside Boys Junior Development Program in San Diego and remains the club director. Seaside has experienced unprecedented regional and national success under Featherstone's leadership. The club has medaled seven times in the open division of the United States Volleyball Association Junior Olympics including two ('92, '97) National Championships at the 18 and under level. This year, Seaside 18 Black, led by California and San Diego Athlete of the Year, Chase Budinger (La Costa Canyon High School), and All CIF, two-sport standout Garrett Muagututia (Francis Parker High School), is poised to compete for yet another National Championship at the Junior Olympics in July.

Seaside has sent over 200 boys to college programs during the past sixteen years with Featherstone directing the club. Coach Featherstone has had the privilege of coaching (5) former Seaside players who have been a part of the USA Men's National Team over the past ten years: Erik Sullivan (LCC), Scott Bunker (Orange Glen), Richard Lambourne (Serra), David Lee (Granite Hills) and Reid Priddy. From Grossmont College, Featherstone coached former Olympians James Hammerstrand and Ben Bodipo, and current Pro Beach (AVP) star Mat Olson. In addition, Grossmont has sent over 40 student-athletes on to four-year programs since 1990.

Coach Featherstone prepped at Mira Costa High School in Manhattan Beach, California. Fred began the school's first boy's volleyball program at the school in 1964. Since then, Micohi has produced more high school All Americans (both male and female), and won more state titles than any high school in the nation. In Featherstone's words . . . "volleyball has been good fun both as a player and coach . . . I was raised four blocks away from the Manhattan Beach pier, the site of the famous Manhattan Beach Open, the 'Wimbledon' of beach volleyball . . . and was fortunate to be able to play in this tournament and many others over the years from age 16 on. . . . volleyball and surfing have been a major part of my lifestyle! I see the sport as the ultimate indoor team game and the beach game as the premier outdoor sport . . . Out West, this is the lifestyle and sport of choice for thousands of young males . . . Simply, this is what we do--ride waves and spike volleyballs . . . The sport belongs . . . It is my mission to help the process along as long as I'm physically and mentally able to do it."

Featherstone's other volleyball coaching stints include the U.S.I.U. (United States International University) women's program from 1980-86, where he led the Division I program into national prominence in 1986; La Jolla High School boys ('73, '74); Southwestern College men ('76, '77) and girls and boys club with the San Diego Volleyball Club ('87-'89). In 1991, Fred coached the men's west team in the Summer Olympic Festival in Los Angeles. Fred is a certified USVBA Cap II program coach and his college career victory total stands at 256.

Featherstone was a three-sport athlete at San Diego State (football, track, volleyball) from '65-'70 and holds a master's degree in physical education from SDSU. At SDSU, Fred was an All American as a sprinter in '66 and '67 and played wide receiver and defensive back on the 1966 and '67 small college national championship football teams coached by Don Coryell. In volleyball, Featherstone has won numerous beach volleyball tournaments including two back-to-back Masters beach doubles championships ('99 and '00) at the 50-54 age level.

Fred is married to wife Cheryl who has two children, Denny and Stacy. Fred's brother John is the Head Football Coach at El Camino College in Torrance, California. Fred and Cheryl like to spend time at the beach in San Diego and travel often through Baja California.



Assistant Coach - Mathew Osburn


In '06, Mat Osburn will replace long-time Griff assistant Jeff Hall.


Jeff is now the men's and women's assistant at UCSD. Having played for Coach Featherstone both as a junior (Seaside VBC '94-'97) and briefly at Grossmont ('98), Osburn brings a lot of playing experience in addition to ample coaching experience over the past ten years.

As a player, Mat was a two-time All CIF Player ('96, '97) at Chula Vista High School and a Junior Olympic All American as a sophomore ('05). Mat was instrumental in leading Seaside VBC to a third place finish at 16 and under at the Junior Olympics in '95 and then again in '97 as a starter on Seaside's 18 and under National Championship team. He is a Hall of Fame Seaside player.

Mat's indoor career was cut short by injury in '98-'99 but he has since earned a AAA rating on the beach. As a coach, he has served as an assistant at Lewis and Clark College (women) in '01; directed the Saddleback VBC boy's program in '02-'03; and won two Eastern League titles as head coach of the boy's team at Point Loma High School in '04-'05. He is currently coaching the Seaside 16-1 club team along with his duties as Coach Featherstone's assistant at Grossmont.

According to Featherstone . . . "Mat has the kind of enthusiasm and passion for coaching volleyball that I admire in young players . . . He is a good technical coach and he understands my philosophy . . . He is capable of training the team in my absence and the players respect his knowledge, motivational posture, and playing ability . . . losing Jeff is a big loss but having Mat replace him is a big plus for the program . . . establishing continuity and maintaining excellence in our program is important to me and Mat will be a major part of that process."
